

JOINING INSTRUCTIONS CARIBBEAN

Welcome to the **Second Star Sailing**! In these Joining Instructions you will find all necessary information about **where to find us, what to expect** during your theory or practical sailing course, and **a detailed packing list**. This may seem like a long read, but trust us, it is going to be worth your time and hopefully answers all your questions!

WHERE ARE WE?

We are in the commercial area of Jolly Harbour (not in the marina). Our school has a cozy office and is at the waterfront – with all school boats at our dock. The building is right next to Al Porto Restaurant, that you can use for navigation upon arrival.

TRAVELING TO ANTIGUA BY AIR

Jolly Harbour is a 30-minute drive from V.C Bird International Airport (ANU) in Antigua. You can take a taxi directly to Jolly Harbor. Pricing may vary with availability but is usually around \$40 USD for a one-way transfer (paid in cash only).

ARRIVING BY CAR TO OUR LOCATION

To join us by car from the airport, follow directions to Jolly Harbour, or have the rental car

company mark it on a map for you. Please note the roads have many potholes and speed bumps so drive cautiously.

ARRIVING BY CAB TO OUR LOCATION

If you come by cab, you can ask the driver to take you to Al Porto Restaurant in Jolly Harbour. Our office building is right next to the restaurant - on the right-hand side.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

All our courses start on Sunday unless informed otherwise. We will meet you at the office at 09:30 AM, the first day of your course.

All our courses finish on Thursday unless informed otherwise. You will be back at the office from a practical course not later than 05:00 PM. Theory courses take place at the office and will finish by 05:00 PM as well. Upon completing the course on Thursday (theory or practical), feel free to join us for a celebratory drink and snacks, sharing good company with fellow students!

PRACTICAL COURSES

Accommodation: you will be staying on board from Sunday to Thursday (05:00 PM). Our pricing is per person, based on double occupancy in each cabin. You will be based on a sailboat - space is limited, and cabins have two berths, so double occupancy is expected. Depending on the boat, you will have double berths, bunk beds, or the option to sleep in the saloon. Please enquire about availability and pricing should you prefer single occupancy of a double cabin.

Provision: We encourage students to collaborate and enjoy preparing meals together. Provisioning is not included in your fee. At the start of the week, everyone contributes to a communal fund for food purchases, with the school covering the instructor's share. Basic provisions like coffee and spices are provided. Meal duties are shared according to a schedule. Provisioning typically costs around 15 USD per person per day.

Should you have any allergies, chemical sensitivities, or dietary restrictions, please be sure to notify us in advance on your medical form as soon as possible so that we can help plan and assist in ensuring you have access to the right kind of products - they might be more difficult to source here in the Caribbean.

Schedule: Our courses begin promptly at 9:30 AM on the first day. Unless informed otherwise, sailing tends to be between 9 AM and 5 PM every day, depending on the type of course and instructor's judgment. Some night sailing is included in most courses, the particulars of the night sail(s) are left to

the instructors to determine with the students. Please be flexible with your schedule. You might be at anchor or on a mooring 2-3 nights during the course. Most courses end at 5pm on the last day, after a thorough cleanup of the boat by everyone, and a debrief with your instructor.

THEORY COURSES

Accommodation: you will need to book accommodation for the duration of your course. We recommend staying at Jolly Harbour from Sunday to Thursday (during the course) – there are many hotels and Airbnb, a big grocery store, restaurants and bars, several beaches, car, and bike rentals.

Provision: there is drinking water available at the office and an option to make a hot drink throughout the day. Please bring your own lunches, snacks, and drinks. You can also purchase food around here or store any food you brought in the fridge at the office. We have a microwave available as well.

Schedule: Our courses begin promptly at 9:30 AM on the first day. Unless informed otherwise, theory courses tend to be between 9 AM and 5 PM every day, with a lunch break and a few coffee breaks.

INSURANCE AND DOCUMENTS

We highly recommend you take out travel insurance to cover your activities on the water. Please investigate what coverage you might have with your local companies as they will differ with your nationality, residence and sailing area. Please check visa requirements relevant to your nationality for Antigua and Barbuda, and other islands that you may visit during your course.

CURRENCY

The currency in Antigua and Barbuda is the Eastern Caribbean Dollar. US dollars are accepted everywhere. You can pay in either currency but will always have change in EC. There are a few ATMs in Jolly Harbour, but we suggest having some cash for cabs.

GEAR AND PACKING

We have safety equipment for everyone onboard, but you are welcome to bring your own if it is suitable. Please double-check with us about your sailing equipment to ensure it meets our safety standards (items like lifejackets, PLB). The rest of the packing list is available below with required and suggested items.

Please remember that on board we cannot stow hard suitcases, only soft sided bags. Should you not have a soft suitcase or duffle bag, we can keep it in storage at the office for the duration of your trip. Pack as lightly as you can - it is warm and lovely in the Caribbean most of the time.

DRUGS, ALCOHOL, SMOKING AND CONDUCT POLICY

Illegal drugs or banned substances are prohibited during our courses. If found under the influence or in possession, you will be removed from the course or charter. Smoking is not allowed on board; you may vape outside with the skipper's permission. Alcohol can be consumed by those of legal drinking age with the instructor's approval, but only after the sailing day is over and the boat is secure. If you are found intoxicated during active participation or while on watch, you will be removed from the course.

Headwear and Eye Protection	Sun hat/cap with a retaining strap	
	Sunglasses with UV protection and a retaining strap	
Health and Sun Protection	Only reef-friendly sunscreen—quick-drying, no spray, and no self-tan. Look for "non-nano zinc oxide" or "non-nano titanium dioxide" on the packaging; otherwise, we will provide it.	Sea sickness medication of your choice
	Medication if prescribed	A second set of required medication for emergency evacuation
Insect Protection	Bug spray (non-toxic). There are no bugs while sailing or at anchor, but lots of mosquitos on shore	After-bite gels (for mosquito bites on shore)
Clothing	Comfortable shorts (preferably quick-dry)	Light fleece vest/jacket or similar
	Pair of long trousers (preferably quick-dry, not jeans)	Lightweight/quick-dry towel (one provided on board, bring an extra if needed)
	Quick-dry short-sleeved shirts	Neck buff for neck/head sun protection
	Long-sleeve sport shirt/top for sun protection	1 pair of sport quick-dry socks (if you use them with your sailing shoes)
	Swimsuit/swim shorts	Going onshore/going out clothing and footwear
Sleeping Gear	Sleeping cocoon (sheets, pillows, and pillowcases are provided)	Light sleeping bag (Caribbean nights are very warm!)
		Earplugs/eye covers (for better sleep in the close quarters)
Accessories	Small waterproof grab bag for documents/essentials (for transferring to shore in the dinghy)	Utility tool or knife (e.g., Leatherman or Gerber)
	A pair of sailing gloves (with or without fingers; gym or bike gloves also suitable)	

	Headlamp or torch with a red-light mode for night sailing	
	Reusable water bottle (preferably plastic, with a carabiner)	
Toiletries	Biocompatible/biodegradable/non-toxic personal products only	You can also look for soaps and shampoos adapted for saltwater use
Electronics	Chargers: USB port and 12-volt chargers available; standard European plugs and voltage when connected to shore power. Antigua uses 220/110V with USA plugs on shore	Power bank or solar charger
Record Keeping	At least 2 extra passport photos. You will need 1 for each certificate awarded (for Day Skipper, Coastal Skipper, Yachtmaster coastal/offshore/ocean programs). If you are taking the Radio VHF course, please bring an extra photo for your application to the RYA/MCA.	Personal Logbook (recommended to keep one; RYA Syllabus & Logbook (G158) available for purchase at the office)
	Notebook and writing materials	Charting/navigation kit (plotter, dividers, pencils, etc. if taking theory courses)
